I am one of many Public Health Nurses in the Valley who work with underprivileged women and children. I started this work in October of 2001. We see endless poverty and need. Very often we arrived in a home because of the birth of a baby, but we soon found that these families had more than one needy child. Then I was introduced to the ladies who ran The Lullaby Connection (TLC), Darla Hayden and Lisa Johnson. They have stood ready to help us do better in our work with their support.

Recently, we have seen the needs of the poor grow even greater when our country and our community suffered a deep recession. The situation for our very needy families was even more dire at that time. The help from The Lullaby Connection did not waiver at that time, even when other resources were reduced; Darla and Lisa were always there to help us. We were able to arrive at each home with a beautiful outfit for a baby girl or a baby boy.

Far from scaling back, the Lullaby Connection started helping us "blow up" Christmas for each child in some of our most disadvantaged families. It was not uncommon for them to help several families, many of whom had as many as 10 children. Each Nurse was allotted a number of families to bring forward to receive this help. This number varied from 2 to 4 per nurse. The nurse could select the neediest families on his/her case load. The nurse working with the mother brought forward a wish list and the TLC and their benefactors made it happen. We Nurses, who had the privilege of playing Santa, saw the joy and wonder on the children's faces. I know in the archives from my clients there are many a heartfelt thank you sent in. Many times the mothers were moved to tears because they could never have provided this on their own.

Besides the steady supply of layettes, on occasion the TLC has given us diapers, gently used clothing, formula, baby supplies and books to help meet our goals to increase literacy among young children.

In more recent years the TLC has also started to provide special outfits for the burial of the little ones who did not make it so the parents can have respectful memories of a child they have lost.

We commend this organization as a great resource and community partner who have helped us in our work with mothers and babies for over a decade.
